



The day the church treasurer resigned, the church asked the local grain elevator manager to take the position. He agreed under two conditions:

- That no treasurer's report would be given for the first year.
- That no questions be asked about finances during that year.

The people were surprised but finally agreed, since most of them did business with him and he was a trusted man. At the end of the year he gave his report:

- The church indebtedness of \$228,000 has been paid.
- The minister's salary has been increased by 8%.
- The Cooperative Program gifts (\$200) have been paid.
- There are no outstanding bills.
- There is a cash balance of \$11,252!

Immediately the shocked congregation asked, "How did you do it? Where did the money come from?"

He quietly answered, "Most of you bring your grain to my elevator. Throughout the year, I simply withheld ten percent on your behalf and gave it to the church in your name. You didn't even miss it!"

"Do you see what we could do for the Lord if we were all willing to give at least the tithe to God, Who really owns it?" he asked. And so the new treasurer had made his point.

Are you able to title 10%? What about 1%, 3%, 5% or 7%, eventually working up to 10%? Would you really miss that amount knowing that it was not yours to begin with? It is the Lord's, given to you as a gift. Deuteronomy 16:16b,17 states "No man should appear before the LORD empty-handed: Each of you must bring a gift in proportion to the way the LORD your God has blessed you."



LWML Convention Bits & Pieces...

- The convention was a wonderful gathering of over 230 people attending! From putting together 300 hygiene kits for the homeless to the Friday night worship service (also attended by some members of local congregations; plus, our CoC Praise Band provided the music) to the Saturday Banquet and the entertainment by "The Oldest Living LWML Member", LWML ladies do things right and know how to get things done!
- Inspired by local pastor, *Rev. Josh Woodrow*, Pastor of Bridge City Community (a Lutheran mission startup church, located in South Chattanooga); and *Jan Struck*, National Christian humorist and motivational speaker, the convention was a success. (Bridge City also was granted funding of \$5,000.00 when the results of the Mission grants were revealed.)
- There are numerous pictures located elsewhere in this newsletter that share more of the convention with you. We hope you feel part of our weekend!
- 17 proposals were submitted for Mission Grants funding, of a budgeted mites goal of \$85,000 for 2018-2020. Upon voting, 13 grants will be funded, and one other will be partial funded. We pray that the final four grants will be fully funded by February of 2020. (FYI... The 2016-2018 budgeted goal of \$79,000 grew to an actual amount of \$81,000 and all Mission Grant proposals were able to be fully funded for this period of time.) Remember the woman who only a mite to give for her offering... LWML ladies of the Mid-South collected \$81,000 in their mite boxes during the last 2 years!!
