

#### **Evangelism Corner - June 2018**

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

~Matthew 28:18b-20

In May, we celebrated Ascension Sunday. While this reading was not part of the Scriptures read this year, many of us were probably thinking about the Great Commission as we likely had to memorize it at some point. However, like many popular passages in the Bible, we like to hear it but don't often think about it. So let's take some time to explore this passage.

Jesus opens with a statement, a profound statement. All too often we rush on to what we are supposed to do, the going and the disciple-making, and we skip this first remark. But it is the groundwork for everything we do.


Christ is risen from the dead, defeating the Devil and giving us justification so that we don't have to die eternally for our sins. He indeed has all authority in heaven and earth, shown in the most remarkable, history-changing way. So it is not a light remark He is making here. *All* authority is His.

What does that mean for us as we prepare to share the Gospel? It means that we speak from the most secure place in the world: the knowledge that Jesus is in power over all things. As Paul says in Romans, whom shall we fear? Coupled with this, though, let us not forget that what follows this remark is a command. Our King has told us to do something. We would be foolish to take that lightly.

Don't hurry past and forget on whose authority all of this rests.



**RESTART YOUR HEART...** Pain and loss are inescapable on this earth; fortunately, the Great Physician specializes in fixing hearts. Our participation is vital to recovery, though, as Danny Gokey sings in "Tell Your Heart to Beat Again."

The song was inspired by a pastor asking to watch a cardiac surgeon — one of his congregants — in action. When the doctor attempted to restart the patient's heart after repairing it, the organ wouldn't cooperate. The surgeon knelt to speak to his patient: "We have fixed your heart. We have repaired it. There is nothing wrong with your heart. If you can hear me, I need you to tell your heart to beat again." And it did — because she did.

"You can get back up again," says Gokey, who faced loss when his first wife died. "You can move forward with your life, and you don't have to walk with a limp." God has fixed our hearts, Gokey says, but we need to recognize that — and begin to hope again.



WALK THE WALK... Do you rush, push, shout and become generally unpleasant on Sunday mornings? Do you complain about church? Are you irregular in your attendance? Are you over-conscientious about matters that are not really important? Do you always criticize the pastor, the choir, the length of services and the usher crew? Then don't be surprised if your children grow up to look at Sundays as the worst day of the week.
